

There is a very important role you play in the election of Toastmasters International Board Members at the Annual Business Meeting on August 18 at the Toastmasters International Annual Convention held August 12-15 in Nassau, Bahamas.

There are key dates you need to be aware of:

- Proxy Assignment will close on August 11 at 11:59 PM Eastern Daylight Time (UTC -4)
- The Online Credentials process runs August 12-15 for proxy holders and Delegates at Large
- Voting will take place at the Annual Business Meeting on August 18
- Voting will be conducted real time. Voting delegates must be present, either onsite or online during the Annual Business Meeting to vote
- Voting Delegates, whether onsite or online will use their own device for voting



Three Essential Pathways Skills for VPEs

If you'll be taking over as club Vice President Education (VPE), make sure your Pathways skills are strong. Here are three essential skills you need to know:

- 1. How to train club members on Pathways
- 2. How to approve level completions properly
- 3. How to keep good records

How to Train Club Members on Pathways

As VPE, you'll be your new club members' first Pathways trainer. That means you'll have to be comfortable enough with Pathways to show new members how to log on, how to choose a path, how to find their Level 1 projects and speech assignments, and how to complete a project. Yes, the Pathways Specialists will be offering Pathways classes throughout the year, but you will still need to be able to help new members along until they can get into a class.

How to Approve Level Completions Properly

One of your duties as VPE is to serve as a Base Camp Manager, responsible for approving members' level completion requests. Always make sure you approve level completions the right way. It's important to verify that the member has completed all speeches and all project requirements before approving their level completion request. Remembering to process the members' awards in Club Central is even more important. That allows the member and the club to receive recognition from Toastmasters International.

How to Keep Good Records

The third essential skill for a VPE is good record-keeping. Develop a record-keeping system that lets you know at a glance where your club members are in Pathways. That way, you'll know at a glance if a member is one or two speeches away from helping the club meet a DCP goal. You'll also be able to catch it if a member forgets to request a level completion.

If you need help with any of these essential skills, don't hesitate to contact me or any Pathways Specialists. We're available to answer questions and offer guidance so you can be successful as VPE.




